

REFUGEE WEEK - JESUIT REFUGEE SERVICE

I missed this last week but it is an important work in the Church. Many refugees have found themselves without support or accommodation as a result of the Coronavirus. The Jesuit Refugee Service is helping with advice and support, delivering food and enabling alternative accommodation to be found. They fund a Detention Centre officer to help those detained. They also have an emergency response team for refugees who get into difficulties. They are supporting over 290 refugees at the moment. Having had to close their drop-in centre they are still providing legal aid, advocacy and by phone emotional support besides practical food and necessities. Have a look at their website: www.jrsuk.net. St. Alban is the patron saint of refugees. Prayer: St. Alban, you gave us an example of hospitality by opening your home to one in need and, as a result of this encounter, were completely changed. We ask that through your intercession we may be given the courage to offer help to those who are forced to flee their homes in search of safety. We ask that in accompanying others as you did we may encounter God in a new way. Saint Alban, Patron of Refugees, pray for us and all refugees around the world. Amen.

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 21st June 2020

TODAY'S READINGS: *We give witness to Jesus, as love knows how....*

It takes tremendous courage to give witness to Christ. Unlike the many martyrs who have gone before us and unlike many Christians today in some parts of the world, we do not have to be afraid of being put to death for Christ. But we certainly risk being hurt - even by people we might know - for being His witnesses. Like Jeremiah in today's first reading, we must trust in the Lord that He will protect us. Jesus tells us today not to be afraid, but rather proclaim from the housetops what we have heard. Don't be concerned with those who can destroy your body, but not your soul; be concerned rather with losing your soul, your very self, for the sake of protecting your standing with the standards of the world. Do not be concerned if people call you names because you have the courage to live your faith. Don't be concerned if people make stories up about you because what they really want to do is deflect attention away from their own shortcomings. Instead, recognise this: when we stand with God, we stand with the Victor. Jesus Christ will win the battle, after all, our battle is His battle and He is with us, *always, yes, to the end of time.*

UPDATE ON RE-OPENING THE CHURCH (IT IS NOT OPEN YET).

Opening the church for private prayer: We are getting there. We have now sent off the necessary papers to the diocese and await their approval to open.

We have a rota prepared but if anyone would still like to help that would be of great use (as long as you are not in any vulnerable category).

Many of the pews will be roped off to avoid needing to clean the whole church so it may not be possible to sit where you normally do. The central pews will all be roped off for example.

There will be hand sanitiser to use on the way in and out, and a one way system, which is required.

The opening times will be 10.00-12.30 weekdays including Saturday and we hope 2.00-4.00 on Sundays.

It is not allowed to be present when Mass is being said yet, so the church will not be open, I am afraid, on Sunday mornings as the live streaming of the Mass is going to continue.
