There is no need to book to attend Mass but if you are looking for a Mass with more space please come along to Sunday evening at 6pm.

Weekend Masses: Saturday 6pm, Sunday 10am and 6pm, and at Sedbergh, 12 noon.

- You need to be wearing a mask or face covering of some sort.
- Please bring a pen to complete the contact slips, one per family.
- Families please sit at the sides and others in the centre.
- Please sit in the middle of the central benches if you arrive early to let others fill in from the edges.
- Collection plate is as you go in or out, or you can ask to complete a standing order. The gift aid boxes are at the front if you have asked for one and not collected it yet.

Weekday Masses: Tuesday – Friday, 12 noon, side benches only are open.

Church is open 10am–12.30pm Monday to Saturday and 2–4pm Sundays. (Many thanks to the volunteer stewards.)

Please be aware of other people's sensitivity and make allowances even if you do not agree. Many people are nervous still about distance and others not wearing masks (which we should be doing anyway even though it is uncomfortable). Thank you for your help. *Fr Hugh*

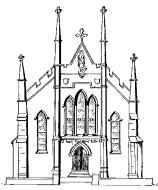

TODAY'S READINGS:

...We will work with each other; we will work side by side...

Why is the host so upset over this man's clothes? After all, he's a traveller, why would he have brought a fine wedding garment with him? However, that question misses the point. The parable isn't about wearing clothes but about wearing Jesus Christ. *Put on the Lord Jesus Christ*, St Paul tells us so many times. The one without the proper clothes is the Christian in name only; the one who refuses to put on Jesus Christ throughout his or her life. This is the person who accepts the invitation of the Lord but refuses to exercise any responsibility in the Christian community, the one who chooses not to give witness to Jesus in his or her life. We are invited to share the intimacy of the Banquet of Heaven. We are invited into God's presence. God doesn't ask a lot from us to be with Him; but He does expect us to wear our Christianity confidently. The way we respond to His love must be evident to the world. People should know that we are Christians by the way we live our lives. Today we pray for the determination, for the perseverance and for the courage to be active in our Christian faith.

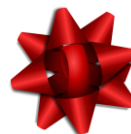

KINGS FOOD BANK: 24,329 meals have been supplied so far this year, a 21% increase on 2019. They have also supplied start up kitchen packs for people moving from hostel accommodation at around £140 each. If you do normally like to donate they need large tins of vegetables, microwave rice, instant mash, custard, sponge puddings. They have plenty of dried pasta, baked beans, soup & cereal. Thank you
