20th December

Collect:

Pour forth, we beseech You, O Lord,
Your grace into our hearts,
that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ Your Son
was made known by the message of an Angel,
may by His Passion and Cross
be brought to the glory of His Resurrection.
Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's prayer:

O Clavis David:

O Key of David, O royal Power of Israel controlling at Your will the gate of Heaven: Come, break down the prison walls of death for those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death; and lead Your captive people into freedom.

Today's prayer:

O Rex Gentium:

O King of all the nations, the only joy of every human heart; O Keystone of the mighty arch of man, come and save the creature You fashioned from the dust.

Isaiah had prophesied:

For a Child is born to us, a Son is given us; upon His shoulder dominion rests. They name Him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:5), and He shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. (Isaiah 2:4).

23rd December St John Kanty

Collect:

Almighty ever-living God, as we see how the Nativity of Your Son according to the flesh draws near, we pray that to us, Your unworthy servants, mercy may flow from Your Word, who chose to become flesh of the Virgin Mary and establish among us His dwelling, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel reading: Luke 1:57-66

Today's prayer: O Emmanuel:

O Emmanuel, King and Lawgiver, desire of the nations, Saviour of all people, come and set us free, Lord our God.

Isaiah had prophesied:

The Lord Himself will give you this sign: the Virgin shall be with child, and bear a son, and shall name Him Emmanuel.

Emmanuel means God is with us.

Come, Lord Jesus, do not delay!

There were many devices used to teach the faith in the early church,
here is one of them - an acrostic:

If we start with the last title and take the first letter of each one —
Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia — we come up the
Latin words ERO CRAS meaning, "Tomorrow, I will be [there]!"
Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for throughout
Advent and whom we have considered in the seven Messianic titles,
now speaks to us: He says, "Tomorrow, I will be [there]!"
So, the 'O Antiphons' not only bring an intensity to our Advent preparation,
they also prepare and lead us into its truly joyful conclusion!

Come quickly, we pray, Lord Jesus, and do not delay, that those who trust in Your compassion may find solace and relief in Your coming. Who live and reign with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever, Amen.
