

The three great martyrs we commemorate today are numbered amongst the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. They suffered death for the Catholic faith which had been outlawed in the kingdom. These three women – St. Margaret Clitherow, St. Anne Line, and St. Margaret Ward – were all martyred because they protected Catholic priests from the Elizabethan authorities, who were seeking out all Catholic priests for execution.

St Gregory the Great, Pray for us

St Gregory the Great (c. 540 – 12 March 604), commonly known as Saint Gregory the Great, was the bishop of Rome from 3rd September 590 to his death. He is known for instigating the first recorded large-scale mission from Rome, the Gregorian Mission, to convert the then-pagan Anglo-Saxons in England to Christianity. Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope
