TODAY'S READINGS:

Brother, sister, let me serve you...

One of the powerful qualities that shines out in Jesus' life was that of generous and loving service. We see it in the way He speaks and cares for people and in the steadfast way He does His Father's will. These examples all inspire and challenge us to ask ourselves how we treat one another. Perhaps the generosity of Jesus is seen most clearly in the way He goes to the Cross to lay down His life to free us from slavery to sin. He never orders us into service, rather He shows us, and then invites us to do as He did. He does this so that we learn to serve Him in serving others. Both St James and St John appear to get hold of the wrong end of the stick; it seems they wanted power and authority. That wasn't what Jesus was calling them to; no, He was calling them, inviting them, to a life of sacrifice and service. We can make that same mistake. It's only in making a genuine sacrifice for others that Jesus gives us the authority to call ourselves Christian. In the Kingdom of God authority comes only through service, never through power.

THE SYNOD PROCESS from 17th October 2021 to October 2023

The Pope has asked the whole Church to take part in a worldwide synod, a gathering of the Church. The title is: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission." The hope is that people will gather in small groups in their parishes and dioceses, and then what comes from these meetings will be what informs the Synod in Rome in 2023. Simply put it is about "How do we walk together from here." The word synod is greek and means 'journeying together.'

How can groups take part? Schools, chaplaincies, religious communities are all asked to take part as well.

What is up for discussion? Not so much traditional doctrine as how the teaching of the Church can be lived and applied to our changing times. It does not mean that wider subjects cannot be discussed but be aware of what the purpose is.

How? We are invited to share our own faith story and experience of the Church, our views of the faith, the way people have found their place in the Church. We are invited to reflect on scripture as well.

As we know when we begin to speak we can spend a lot of time talking about our own lives, and there is nothing wrong in that, but essentially we need to listen to other people's as well and reflect openly and in acceptance of their journey. We have to accept that other people's journey has been different to ours. We have to listen to what the Spirit might be saying to our group as well.

We may be asked to try to summarise what our group have come up with and share it if we think appropriate.

Each diocese will work out how best to do this and the Bishop is writing to us this weekend about his thoughts on this.

The diocesan part of the process should end in April.
