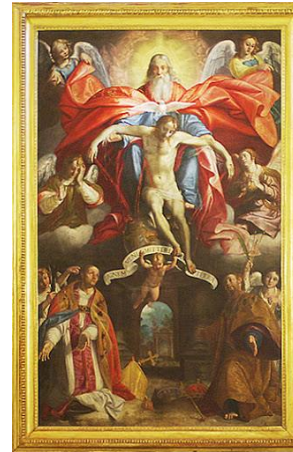

## **TODAY'S READINGS**

***Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit...***



The fact that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – One God in Three Persons – could only be known if God had revealed it to us. We could never discover this in our own. Today's great Feast is not only an opportunity for thanking God for showing us more about Himself it is also an occasion for us to take courage and strive for a deeper unity within both the community of the Godhead and the community that is the human family. God reveals Himself to us in order that we become more like Him as we get to know Him. This knowledge influences the way we live and the way we treat one another. Our faith is not an individual faith, but one which involves relationships with God and with each other. The Church is a family; it is a community of believers, who strive to live in unity. We reflect – admittedly and imperfectly - the living, loving and creative unity that is relationship we call the Holy Trinity. Families depend on good relationships to function, faith is the same. We grow into a deeper relationship when we give of ourselves to God and to one another, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit give themselves to each other completely. As we give glory and honour to God this day, let us strive to do the same to whoever we meet in the days ahead.

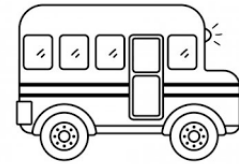

foodbank**

*“Now more than ever before the pies in tins are not the best item to buy for the food bank. You might wonder why! If you consider the amount of energy it takes to heat the oven, then the cooking time, it is very often not feasible or affordable for someone to be able to do this. Another reason might be that a person does not have an oven.”*

The Foodbank often put together foods for people who only have access to a microwave or even just a kettle. Donations of foods that can be heated by these methods are most appreciated – instant packet pasta or noodles are ideal. The Kings Foodbank has been reaching out to the community for 10 years now. 22,290 meals were provided from January to the end of May, an 11% increase on last year.
