Today's prayer: The 'Regina Caeli'

(while usually said each day during Eastertide in place of the Angellus. Today seems a fitting opportunity to pray this beautiful prayer.)

Queen of heaven, rejoice, alleluia.

The Son whom you merited to bear, alleluia, has risen as He said, alleluia.

Pray to God for us, alleluia.

V. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia.

R. For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia.

O God,

who by the resurrection of Your Son Jesus Christ gave gladness to the world;


grant that we, being helped by the Virgin Mary, may attain to the joys of eternal life.

The author of Regina Caeli is unknown, but by virtue of its presence (or absence) in manuscripts, it had to have been composed sometime between the 9th and 12th centuries. One possible author in that time period is Pope Gregory V (+998). Its original use appears to have been in Rome where it was used as an Antiphon for Vespers at Easter.

Today's Prayer:

Run, hasten, O Lady, and in your mercy

We sigh with love and grief, for we are oppressed on every side.
How can we do other than sigh to you,
