TODAY'S READINGS:

We have been trusted to look after something precious ...

God has given us all many and various gifts; some of which are personal gifts, others are common to us all. All these gifts need to be treasured, looked after and used. It is in fact three of those shared gifts that make us a living Christian people. The first comes with our baptism when we were gifted with the blessing of being welcomed as a Child of God; this blessing is the gateway to a rewarding spiritual life. The second is the Word of God brought together for us in the Bible. The Bible is not a self-help book but rather it is God telling us about Himself, about His Life, and how we are to live and celebrate our life. The third is the Eucharist.
