TODAY'S READINGS:

Let us pray...

The Amalekites challenged the Hebrews to a decisive battle. Moses watched from a distance. His brother Aaron and his companion, Hur, stayed with Moses. If Moses arms were raised holding his staff - the power of God - the Israelites were winning; when his arms came down, the Amalekites were winning. The position of his raised-up arms is an ancient one of prayer. While Moses remained united to God in prayer, God's power prevailed. Yet Moses couldn't do it alone; he needed the support of others; even with help, it took all Moses had to persevere. The gospel also, humorously, demonstrates perseverance in prayer. Nobody could tell the unjust judge what to do until he meets this widow, but she just wouldn't give it a rest! She knew she what was right, and she wanted justice! She badgered him night and day. She kept pestering the judge for a just decision. Moses kept his arms raised in prayer until the Israelites won. Jesus says the most important thing about prayer is to *pray continually*. So let us keep raising our arms to God in prayer and let us keep pestering God - for He always listens, hears and loves us.
