I, therefore, now do once again renounce Satan; I renounce all his works; I renounce all his allurements.

The Apostles; Creed: I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. Saint Kentigern, Pray for us Saint Hilary of Poitiers, Pray for us Saint Abra of Poitiers, Pray for us

St Kentigern, also known as Mungo ('Dear One'), was born in Culross, Fife, Scotland. The Christian king of Strathclyde welcomed the saint and arranged his consecration as bishop in around 540. His holy example and his preaching drew together a large community known as 'Clasgu' ('dear family'), which ultimately grew into the town and city of Glasgow. A strong anti-Christian movement forced him to go to Wales, staying for a time with Saint David at Menevia. But after founding a large monastery at Llanelwy, later called St Asaph's, he returned with some of his Welsh disciples to Galloway and Cumberland and then back to Glasgow in 581, where he was visited by Saint Columba.

St Hilary of Poitiers (c. 310 – c. 367) was Bishop of Poitiers and a Doctor of the Church. He was sometimes referred to as the "Hammer of the Arians" (Malleus Arianorum) and the "Athanasius of the West". His name comes from the Latin word for happy or cheerful. In addition to his important work as bishop, Hilary was married and the father of Abra of Poitiers, a nun and saint who became known for her charity.
