HUMAN TRAFFICKING - MEDAILLE TRUST: "Today Medaille Trust runs ten safe houses across the country, making it one of the UK's largest providers of supported accommodation for victims of modern slavery. Our work is guided by the principles of Catholic Social Teaching: human dignity, solidarity, preferential option for poor and vulnerable people, and the dignity of work. Saint Josephine Bakhita's Story: Born in Olgossa in the Darfur region of southern Sudan, Josephine was kidnapped at the age of 7, sold into slavery and given the name Bakhita, which means fortunate. She was resold several times, finally in 1883 to Callisto Legnani, Italian consul in Khartoum, Sudan. Two years later, he took Josephine to Italy and gave her to his friend Augusto Michieli. Bakhita became babysitter to Mimmina Michieli, whom she accompanied to Venice's Institute of the Catechumens, run by the Canossian Sisters. While Mimmina was being instructed, Josephine felt drawn to the Catholic Church. She was baptised and confirmed in 1890, taking the name Josephine. When the Michielis returned from Africa the future saint refused to go. During the ensuing court case, the Canossian Sisters and the patriarch of Venice intervened on Josephine's behalf. The judge concluded that since slavery was illegal in Italy, she had actually been free since 1885. Josephine entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893. She soon became well loved by the children attending the sisters 'school and the local citizens. She once said, "Be good, love the Lord, pray for those who do not know Him. What a great grace it is to know God!"

Anyone who is paying UK tax on income can join the Gift Aid scheme where the parish can claim back tax on your offertory or one-off donations.

#### Last year we claimed back just over £10,0000!

The parish is allowed to claim back the 20p of tax for every 80p you donate so, for example, if you put £5 in the collection each week the parish can reclaim the tax you paid on this (£1.25) back from the Government every week. Donations can be given by weekly offertory envelopes (provided by the parish), cheque or monthly standing order. It doesn't cost you any more, it is confidential and you can cancel at any time.
