Having nominated two candidates, Joseph known as Barsabbas, whose surname was Justus, and Matthias,







The image of Jesus we see in today's Gospel is like that of a good friend calling for the protection of those who were given to him and whom he is now sending out in his name. What does Jesus want for his friends?

"...that they may have my joy made complete in themselves." This Gospel is part of Jesus' Farewell Discourse to his disciples. While he is still with them, he speaks as one who has already departed, one who knows that the world will be hostile to his friends as it is about to be for him. We can read this text today assured that what Jesus says about his disciples, he says about all of his followers, for us too. What does it mean to have the joy of Christ made complete in you?

Jesus is aware of the struggles that his disciples of every age face and will face. His message is counter-cultural and will meet resistance in all times. But it is a message of truth, of love and justice for all people. Our world is badly in need of truth, love and justice and those who proclaim such messages will no doubt face backlash and criticism. Today's Gospel offers us this image of Jesus who deeply cares for those who have been entrusted to him, that they will be protected, that they will experience his joy, that despite the challenges we face he has given us God's Word. This week, enter into this passage in contemplation, allow the words to settle in your heart. Imagine Jesus speaking these words about you! How does this make you feel? How do you experience Christ's joy?
