

He was born in Antioch, Turkey and died in 79AD at Ravenna

St Lawrence of Brindisi, Pray for us

Lawrence of Brindisi (22 July 1559 – 22 July 1619), born Giulio Cesare Russo, was a priest and a theologian as well as a member of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. An accomplished linguist, in addition to his native Italian, Lawrence could read and speak Latin, Hebrew, Greek, German, Czech, Spanish, and French fluently. Lawrence was ordained a priest at the age of 23. He was beatified on 1 June 1783 and canonized as a saint on 8 December 1881.
