

St John Vianney, Pray for us

St John Vianney (8th May 1786 · Dardilly - 4th Aug 1859 · Ars-sur-Formans) He is often referred to as the Curé d'Ars ("the parish priest of Ars"). He is known for his priestly and pastoral work in his parish in Ars, resulting in the radical spiritual transformation of the community and its surroundings. He is noted for his saintly life, mortification, persevering ministry in the sacrament of confession, and ardent devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was canonized in 1925.

Pope Francis' Prayer to Mary at the conclusion of the Encyclical 'Lumen Fidei' (29th June 2013)

Today's feast focuses our attention on a church building - the basilica of St Mary Major in Rome. It is one of the oldest and most important shrines in the world dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tradition says that in August 352 the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a wealthy nobleman in Rome. She asked that a church be built on the spot where he would find snow. On that hot summer day, snow mysteriously appeared on the Esquiline Hill and a church was built on the spot and it was dedicated to Our Lady of the Snows.

August 1170 at Caleruega, Spain and died on 6th August 1221, he is buried in
the Basilica of San Domenico, Bologna.*
