### TODAY'S READINGS: *When the Lord corrects you do not treat it lightly...*

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns us about the danger of presumption. It's that attitude some people slip into—thinking they don't really need to make any sacrifices for the Kingdom of God. All through life, opportunities to follow Him are there, but they choose the easier path. Instead of the narrow door, they go for the wide one—the door that says, “Everyone's doing it, so it must be alright.” But the truth is, there comes a day when the Master closes the door. Our earthly life is over, and we stand before Him. Those who never really tried to live for Christ may knock, expecting to be welcomed in—presuming God's mercy will just cover everything automatically. Yet they never lifted a finger to serve Him. And the Master's words are sobering: “Away from me.” The message is clear: we can't take Heaven for granted. We can't assume eternal glory without actually committing ourselves to Christ here and now. So let's not delay. Let's keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, trust His mercy, and follow Him wherever He leads.

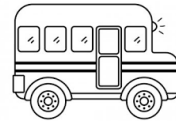
