TODAY'S READINGS: *Faith is the assurance of things hoped for...*

The Letter to the Hebrews was written to believers tempted to waver in their faith. They feared persecution from the Romans—the pagan rulers of their world—and even hostility from their own people who had not accepted Jesus as the fulfilment of God's promise to Abraham. We face something similar today. Last week's reading urged us: hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees! This week's reading invites us to see the gifts God offers: His Presence, His Life, His Peace—His eternal joy. So let us steady those trembling knees and walk with Him! We have no reason to be afraid. Whatever others may say or do, they cannot take Jesus Christ from us, nor keep us from His Presence, now or in eternity. What we are called to is not a cringing fear, but the holy Fear of the Lord: the reverence of mature faith, born not from dread of punishment but from a burning desire to live in the fullness of His love and mercy.

...and the conviction of things not seen!

SEASON OF CREATION 2025

This week we keep the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, which also marks the beginning of the Season of Creation. This special time invites us to deepen our relationship with God, with one another, and with the earth we share.

Pope Francis reminds us in *Laudato Si'* that "*the entire material universe speaks of God's love*" (§84). Creation is not just background to our lives; it is the gift through which God provides for us and draws us back to Him. To listen to creation is also to hear "*the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor*" (§49), since it is the vulnerable who suffer most when our common home is harmed.

At the heart of this season is prayer—prayer that praises the Creator, prayer that asks for the grace of conversion, and prayer that strengthens us to act with love and courage. Each of us can live this call in simple ways: by daily choices of care, by seeing God's hand in creation, and by compassion for those most affected by environmental harm.

Christ, the Ruler of All, is still in the boat with us. He calls us not to fear, but to trust, to pray, and to care—for creation and for one another.
