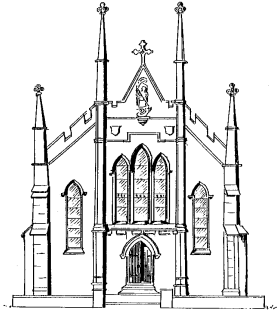

Prayer Before the Crucifix

Behold, O good and sweetest Jesus,
I cast myself upon my knees in Your sight,

St Robert Bellarmine, Patron of catechists, Pray for us

St Hildegard of Bingen, Pray for us

St Hildegard of Bingen (Böckelheim on the Nahe, 1098; died on the Rupertsberg near Bingen, 1179) *She was not only a brilliant composer, artist, and visionary, she was also an herbalist. Her belief in the "greening of man," or 'viriditas' as she called it, led her to trust that God had given mankind herbs, spices, and foods to serve our bodies and keep us not only healthy but full of joy and peace.*

St Robert Bellarmine (Italian: Roberto Francesco Romolo Bellarmino; 4 October 1542 – 17 September 1621) *was an Italian Jesuit and a cardinal. He was one of the most important figures in the Counter-Reformation. He was a professor of theology and later rector of the Roman College, and in 1602 became Archbishop of Capua. He supported the reform decrees of the Council of Trent.*

St Theodore of Canterbury, Pray for us

St Theodore of Tarsus (c.602 – 19th September 690) was Archbishop of Canterbury from 668 to 690. Theodore grew up in Tarsus but fled to Constantinople after the Persian Empire conquered Tarsus and other cities. After studying there, he relocated to Rome and was later installed as the Archbishop of Canterbury on the orders of Pope Vitalian. Accounts of his life appear in two 8th-century texts. Theodore is best known for his reform of the English Church and establishment of a school in Canterbury.

St Januarius (21st April 232 – 19th September 305) He was Bishop of Benevento and is a martyr. While no contemporary sources on his life are preserved, later sources and legends say he died during the Great Persecution] which ended with Diocletian's retirement in 305.

Saturday – The Korean Martyrs

Today's Gospel reading: Luke 9:23-26

Today's prayer:

O God, you have created all nations and You are their salvation.
In the land of Korea Your call to Catholic faith formed a people of
adoption, whose growth You nurtured by the blood of Andrew, Paul, and
their companions. Through their martyrdom and their intercession grant
us strength that we too may remain faithful to Your commandments even
until death.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

St Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Pray for us
St Paul Chong Ha-sang, Pray for us
All Holy Martyrs of Korea, Pray for us

St Andrew Kim Taegon, the first native Korean priest, was martyred in 1846 after secretly working to bring missionaries into Korea. His father, Ignatius, and many others—including Paul Chong Hasang, Columba and Agnes Kim, young Peter Ryou, and nobleman Protase Chong—also died for the faith. Christianity, introduced in 1592, spread despite persecution. In 1984, Pope John Paul II canonized 103 Korean martyrs, mostly laypeople, honouring their courage and witness.
