

St Cosmas, Pray for us

St Damian, Pray for us

Saints Cosmas and Damian were third century Arabian-born twin brothers who embraced Christianity and practised medicine and surgery without a fee. This led them to being named 'anargyroi' (from the Greek meaning, "the silverless" or "unmercenaries"); by this, they attracted many to the Christian faith. They reputedly cured blindness, fever, paralysis and reportedly expelled a serpent. They were arrested by Lysias, governor of Cilicia (modern-day Cukurova, Turkey) during the Diocletian persecution because of their faith and fame as healers. Emperor Diocletian, who favoured the worship of the Olympian gods, issued a series of edicts that condemned the Christians with the goal of eliminating Christianity from the Roman Empire.

Saturday – St Vincent de Paul

Priest - *patron saint of charitable organizations and workers,*

Collect:

O God, who for the relief of the poor
and the formation of the clergy
endowed the Priest Saint Vincent de Paul
with apostolic virtues,
grant, we pray, that, afire with that same spirit,
we may love what he loved
and put into practice what he taught.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,
who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel reading: Matthew 9:35-38

Today's Prayer: Prayer To St Vincent de Paul

Noble Saint Vincent de Paul, beloved servant of the poor,
may we follow your example and do good works
among those whom society has abandoned, enslaved, or forgotten.
Inspire us to feed the hungry, to love a child,
to provide comfort and medicine to the sick,
to clothe those whose garments are threadbare,
and to offer hope and our Lord's words to all who need respite.

St Vincent de Paul, Pray for us

St Vincent de Paul (1581–1660) was a French priest renowned for his compassion and tireless service to the poor. Ordained in 1600, he dedicated his life to works of charity, founding the Congregation of the Mission (Lazarists) and, with St Louise de Marillac, the Daughters of Charity. He reformed clergy formation, cared for orphans, and inspired countless works of mercy. Canonized in 1737.
