TODAY'S READINGS: *Let us pray...*

The Amalekites confronted the Hebrews in a fierce and decisive battle. From a nearby hill, Moses looked on, accompanied by his brother Aaron and his friend Hur. When Moses lifted his arms, holding the staff of God, Israel prevailed; when he grew weary and lowered them, their enemies gained ground. The uplifted arms of Moses formed one of the oldest postures of prayer — a sign of total dependence on God. As long as Moses remained steadfast in prayer, God's strength was with His people. But Moses could not stand alone; he needed others beside him. With their support, he persevered until victory was won. In the Gospel, Jesus tells a story of perseverance, too — this time with a touch of humour. A corrupt judge refuses to listen to anyone until he meets a widow who simply won't give up. Day after day she demands justice, wearing him down with her persistence. In the end, her sheer determination wins the case. Both stories remind us that prayer means holding on — not giving up when we grow tired or discouraged. So let us, like Moses and the widow, keep lifting our hearts and hands to God, trusting that He always listens, always cares, and always loves.

...Keep trying, don't give up!
