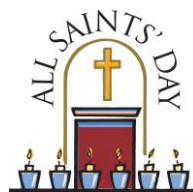
Pray it at home, on a walk, or with a few friends. However you take it up, let the Rosary continue to shape your prayer and strengthen your faith.

TODAY'S READINGS:

From earth's wide bounds, from ocean's farthest coast...

Today's feast draws our eyes to Heaven and our hearts to hope. The saints are not distant figures in stained glass but men and women who lived the Beatitudes with courage. They were poor in spirit, trusting in God; they mourned the world's pain and brought comfort; they hungered for righteousness and worked for peace. On the mountainside, Jesus gave us not rules but a portrait of holiness — His own reflection shining in those who follow Him. The Beatitudes reveal what it means to live the Gospel: to be merciful rather than proud, pure in heart rather than divided, ready to forgive, ready to love. The saints show that these blessings are possible in every life. Some, like St Thérèse of Lisieux, found holiness in the small and hidden, others, like St Oscar Romero, in truth and sacrifice. Yet they are more than models — they are friends in Heaven, praying for us as we journey on. Think of your own patron saint: do you ever ask their help? Today we thank God for that countless host who have reached their rest and pray for grace to follow where they have gone.
