

St Bruno, Pray for us

*St Bruno of Cologne (c. 1030 – 6th October 1101)
was the founder of the Carthusian Order;
he personally founded the order's first two communities.
He was a celebrated teacher at Reims,
and a close advisor of his former pupil, Pope Urban II.*
