TODAY'S READINGS:

Love is His word, love is His way, feasting with friends, fasting alone...

Today we celebrate Jesus Christ, the King of kings. Everything Jesus did was centred on serving His Father. He showed us what real service looks like: healing the sick, raising the dead, and urging His followers to care for those in need. Just before giving us the great gift of the Eucharist, Jesus knelt down and washed His disciples' feet. Then He told them — and tells us still — that we must do for others what He has done for us. In the Eucharist we receive His Body, given for us, and His Blood, poured out for us. When we come forward for Communion, we are united to the One who calls us to give ourselves generously for others in love. Throughout life we all face choices. We can choose the way that wins approval or popularity, or we can choose the Christian way — the way that helps God's Kingdom become visible in our world. Christ our King frees us from feeling trapped by the world's expectations. He calls us to serve Him in what we do and what we say, and to live our faith with joy each day.
