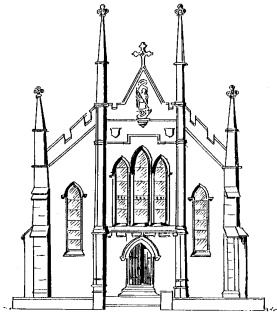

**St Hilda of Whitby**, Abbess

**St Hugh of Lincoln**, Bishop, patron saint of sick children, sick people, cobblers, swans, and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Nottingham

**St Elizabeth of Hungary**, Religious, patron saint of nurses

## **Today's prayer: A Prayer of St Hilda**

My times are in Your hand, my times are in Your hand. Amen.

## **In honour of St Hugh**

Holy God, who endowed Your servant Hugh of Lincoln with wise and cheerful boldness and taught him to commend the discipline of holy life to kings and princes: Grant that we also, rejoicing in the Good News of Your mercy, and fearing nothing but the loss of You, may be bold to speak the truth in love, in the name of Jesus Christ who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

## **To St Elizabeth of Hungary**

Saint Elizabeth, you were always poor in spirit, most generous toward the poor, faithful to your husband and fully consecrated to your Divine Bridegroom. Grant your help to widows and widowers and keep them faithful to their heavenly Lord. Teach them to make use of their time in the service of God our Lord.

*St Hilda of Whitby (c. 614–680) founding abbess of the monastery at Whitby, which was chosen as the venue for the Synod of Whitby. A very important figure in the Christianisation of Anglo-Saxon England, she was abbess at several monasteries and recognised for her wisdom that drew kings to her for advice.*

*St Hugh of Lincoln (c. 1135-1140 – 16<sup>th</sup> November 1200), a French noble, Benedictine monk, then bishop of Lincoln. At the time of the Reformation, he was the best-known English saint after St Thomas Becket.*

*St Elizabeth of Hungary (7th July 1207 – 17<sup>th</sup> November 1231), a princess of the Kingdom of Hungary and example of living charity. She is the patroness of Third Order of St Francis.*

*The Dedication of the present Roman Basilicas of Saint Peter (the Vatican), and Saint Paul's Outside the Walls, both of which replace older buildings built by Constantine in the fourth century over the tombs of the apostles Sts Peter and Paul. The dedication of these churches has been commemorated together on this day since the 12<sup>th</sup> century, and today's feast direct us to pray for the unity of the Church throughout the world*
