



READINGS FOR THE HOLY FAMILY:

O see within a creature's hand the vast Creator deigns to be...

Is it really so unrealistic for the Church to hold up the Holy Family as a model for our own families? Not because every household looks the same, but because family life, at its heart, remains love gathered around a child. In that sense, the Holy Family is profoundly realistic, rooted in the everyday work of care, sacrifice, and faith. Like Joseph, parents are called to protect their families from what would harm them. Herod no longer sends soldiers, but other forces still threaten — addiction, distorted priorities, and materialism that slowly erode the soul. Protection today is shared: both parents standing together with courage and care. Like Mary, parents nurture not only bodies, but hearts. Children learn to recognise God less through instruction than through what they see lived each day — choices for goodness, generosity, and compassion. Family life revolves around children for a time, and then they are sent out into the world. Often it is through loving them that parents themselves are changed, making God's love visible and real.

READINGS FOR FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT:

...a virgin shall conceive and bear a son...

St Elizabeth stands at the very heart of Israel's Temple tradition. By marriage and by faith she belongs to the best of the ancient people of God, formed by generations who knew both God's nearness and God's mystery. The Temple had always been a sign rather than a cage — a place of meeting, not a boundary. Israel resisted the pagan habit of building shrines everywhere, knowing that the living God could never be confined by walls, stone, or ritual. And yet they longed for a place where heaven might brush the earth, where the Holy One could be honoured and encountered. In Elizabeth, that longing takes flesh. Her own body becomes the living Temple, carrying within it the child who would prepare the way for the Lord. John stirs and leaps in her womb at the presence of Christ hidden within Mary. The joy of the prophets, the hope of Israel, and the promise of the Temple all converge in that moment. John—the final voice of the old covenant—becomes the first witness of the new, already pointing beyond himself to the Lamb of God. What the Temple once signified, Christ now fulfils. God is no longer approached only in sacred spaces but comes among us in flesh and blood. Jesus is Emmanuel — God-with-us — and through Him, we too are made living temples, called to bear His presence into the world.
