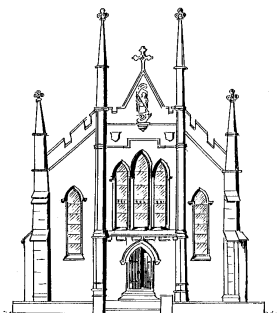

Today's Gospel reading: Matthew 2:13-15,19-23

God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel: John 1:1-18

Today's prayer:

Saint Sylvester, a successor of St Peter,
you gained the liberty of Christians
after three centuries of persecution and shared with them
the happiness of being able to publicly profess their faith in Jesus Christ.
You proclaimed His divinity in the face of powerful opposition
and worked tirelessly to preserve the unity of all who acknowledge
Jesus as their Lord and Saviour.

Grant your protection especially
to those who are unjustly deprived of their freedom,
to those who are victims of oppression and torture,
to those whose human and civil rights are trampled upon.

Intercede for them, that God may be
their refuge and strength in all their trials.

Help us, after your example, to have the courage of our convictions
and never betray our faith.

Be mindful of us and inspire us to imitate your holiness of life.

Saint Sylvester, pray for us.

Thursday – Mary, Mother of God

Collect:

O God, who through the fruitful virginity of Blessed Mary bestowed on the human race the grace of eternal salvation, grant, we pray, that we may experience the intercession of her, through whom we were found worthy to receive the author of life, our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son. Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel reading: Luke 2:16-21

Today's prayer:

Father, source of light in every age,
the virgin conceived and bore Your Son
Who is called Wonderful God,
Prince of Peace.
May her prayer,
the gift of a mother's love,
be Your people's joy through all ages.
May her response,
born of a humble heart,
draw Your Spirit to rest on Your people.
Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Collect:

Cast Your kindly light upon Your faithful, Lord, we pray,
and with the splendour of Your glory
set their hearts ever aflame,
that they may never cease to acknowledge their Savior
and may truly hold fast to him.
Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel reading: John 1:19-28

Today's prayer:

O God, who were pleased to give light to Your Church
by the example and teaching
of the Bishops Saints Basil and Gregory,
grant, we pray,
that in humility we may learn Your truth
and practice it faithfully in charity.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,
who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Saturday – before the Epiphany

Collect:

Today's Gospel reading: Jn 1: 29-34

Today's prayer:

Glory to You Lord God,
almighty God and Father,
we give You thanks and praise You for Your glory
and rejoice in the birth of Your incarnate Son.
Cradled in a manger He sustains the world with His love
and nourishes us with the gift of Himself,
for He is the Bread of Life, who has come down from Heaven
to live in the midst of His people.
Open our hearts to His presence in our lives
and send us out to share the good news of salvation He brings.
We ask this through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
