TODAY'S READINGS:

Lord, we Thy presence seek; may ours this blessing be...

Today's readings open with the voice of a prophet we rarely hear from — Zephaniah. And fittingly, he speaks about something we often try to sidestep: humility. Not the false kind that puts us down, but the kind that quietly makes room for God. His words go straight to the heart of the Christian life — our relationship with the Lord. Zephaniah addresses what he calls the “humble of the land.” He speaks of a promise: even when God's judgement passes over the world, a small remnant will remain — people who are lowly, honest, and open-hearted. They are not weighed down by deceit or self-importance. They are not crammed full of themselves. Instead, they leave space for God to act within them. That is the heart of humility. Humility is openness — a readiness to receive God rather than to replace Him. Pride closes the door; humility leaves it ajar. A proud person has little need of God, because everything already seems to revolve around the self. A humble person knows how easily we lose our way without God at the centre. True humility also sharpens our sight. It helps us recognise God's presence in other people, God's truth spoken in unfamiliar ways, and God quietly at work in our own lives. The humble heart is always searching, always listening, always seeking the Lord wherever He may be found. So today we pray, quite simply, for that gift — the grace of humility: not to think less of ourselves, but to make more room for God.
