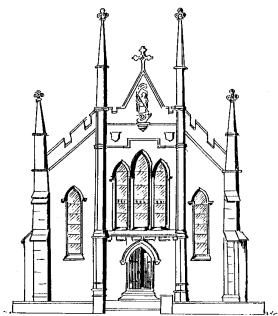

St Wulstan, Bishop

patron saint of vegetarians and dieters

St Wulstan, Pray for us

that we may become worthy to enter into the joys of eternal life.

St Wulstan (1008-1095) was born at Long Itchington in Warwickshire.

In his early youth, he was noted for his special religious and spiritual nature. He studied at Evesham and Peterborough Abbeys and then joined the Benedictine Monastery, in Worcester where he was ordained a priest in 1038. He served as Prior until in 1062 was appointed Bishop of Worcester. He was the last surviving pre-Conquest bishop and the only English-born bishop after 1075. St Wulstan is the patron Saint of vegetarians and dieters due to his being distracted at Mass one day by the smell of a cooking goose, after which event he swore never to eat meat again!

Tuesday – Week 2

St Fabian, Pope and Martyr - *Patron of athletes and soldiers*

St Sebastian, Martyr - *Patron saint of archers and athletes and of those who desire a saintly death.*

St Sebastian, Pray for us

*Pope Saint Fabian (200, Rome – 250, Rome)
was the bishop of Rome from 10th January 236 until his death on 20th January
250. A dove is said to have descended on his head to mark him as the Holy
Spirit's unexpected choice to become the next pope.*

*Saint Sebastian (256 Narbonne, France - 287, Rome) was killed during during
the Roman emperor Diocletian's persecution of Christians. He was initially tied
to a post or tree and shot with arrows, though this did not kill him.
He was, according to tradition, rescued and healed by Saint Irene of Rome.*

Wednesday – St Agnes

Martyr - Patron saint of children, engaged couples, victims of sexual abuse, and gardeners

Almighty ever-living God,
who choose what is weak in the world to confound the strong,
mercifully grant,
that we, who celebrate the heavenly birthday of Your Martyr Saint Agnes,
may follow her constancy in the faith.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,
who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Gospel reading: Matthew 13:44-46

Today's prayer:

St Agnes, you refused to give up your faith;
help us to be proud of our faith,
to love it, to be strong in it, and to give witness to it daily.
St Agnes, patron saint of children,
watch over the children of the world;
keep them safe from harm;
be with them in their hour of need;
and always pray for them. Amen.

St Agnes, Pray for us that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ

St Agnes (fourth Century) is one of the most-celebrated Roman martyrs. According to tradition, she was a beautiful girl, about 12 or 13 years old, who refused marriage, stating that she could have no spouse but Jesus Christ. Her suitors revealed her Christianity, which was then condemned as a cult, and in punishment she was exposed in a brothel. Awed by her purity and presence, all but one of the Roman youths left her untouched; in his attempt to violate her, the sole attacker was miraculously struck blind, whereupon Agnes healed him with prayer. Later, after refusing to renounce her faith, she was murdered during the persecution of the Christians by the Roman emperor Diocletian and was buried beside the Via Nomentana. On her feast day two lambs are blessed in the Church of Sant'Agnese in Rome, and from their wool are made the pallia sent by the pope to archbishops as tokens.

Thursday – Week 2

St Vincent of Saragossa, Deacon - *patron saint of: wine-makers, wine-merchant, vinegar-makers; Order of Deacons*

Today's Gospel reading: Mark 3:7-12

Today's prayer:

Holy God, Saint Vincent served You as a permanent deacon
and gave his whole life and soul to You,
even to the point of becoming a martyr.
I lift up to You the deacons of the Church
and all those who are being called by God to become deacons.
Guide them as they discern how to serve the Body of Christ.
Prevent the attractions of the world and the busyness of secular jobs
from interfering with their vocations.
Teach them to grow in humility.
Help their families learn from their examples
and support their diaconates with trust and joy.

Saint Vincent, pray for us.

St Vincent of Saragossa (d. c. 304) was a deacon and martyr under the persecution of Emperor Diocletian. Arrested with his bishop Valerius, Vincent endured imprisonment and brutal torture with unshaken faith. His courageous witness and eloquent confession of Christ made him one of the most venerated martyrs of the early Church.
