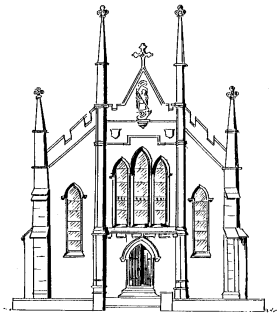

Sts Timothy and Titus, Pray for us

Sts Timothy and Titus were disciples and co-workers of St Paul. Timothy accompanied Paul on his travels. He was put in charge of the Church at Ephesus. Titus was Paul's messenger to various Christian communities where disputes arose, and he was in charge of the Church at Crete. To these two St Paul wrote his pastoral epistles

St Angela, Pray for us

St Angela Merici was born on March 21st, 1474 at Desenzano on Lake Garda; left an orphan at the age of ten she was brought up by her uncle and on his death went to live with her brothers. She was a devout girl and, having joined the Third Order of St Francis, devoted herself to teaching children. As her work became known she was asked to go to Brescia where a house was put at her disposal and a number of women came to join her; there she established a religious association of women, under the patronage of St Ursula. Her sisters while remaining in the world, should devote themselves to every sort of corporal and spiritual work of mercy; but the particular emphasis was on education. Angela preferred to send her sisters to teach girls in their own families, - not in convent schools - one of her favorite sayings was, 'Disorder in society is the result of disorder in the family'. It was by educating children where they lived that she strove to improve social conditions. St Angela died in Brescia on January 27th 1540.

Wednesday – St Thomas Aquinas

Doctor of the Church - *Patron saint of universities and scholars.*

Make me, O Lord, obedient without complaint, poor without regret, patient
without murmur, humble without pretense, joyous without frivolity, and truthful
without disguise. Give me, O God, an everwatchful heart which nothing can
ever lure away from You; a noble heart, which no unworthy affection can draw
downwards to the earth; an upright heart, which no evil can warp;
an unconquerable heart, which no tribulation can crush;
a free heart, which no perverted affection can claim for its own.
Bestow on me, O God, understanding to know You,
diligence to seek You, and wisdom to find You; a life which may please You,
and a hope which may embrace You at the last.

*Thomas Aquinas (28th January 1225, Roccasecca, Italy - 7th March 1274,
Fossanova Abbey, Italy). He was a Dominican friar and an immensely
influential scholastic philosopher; theologian, his influence on Western thought
is considerable, and much of modern philosophy developed or opposed his
ideas, particularly in the areas of ethics, natural law, metaphysics, and political
theory.*

St John Bosco, Pray for us

St John Bosco (1815–1888) was an Italian priest and educator devoted to the young, especially the poor and abandoned. Founder of the Salesians, he combined faith, reason, and kindness in his pastoral care. His joyful spirit, practical charity, and trust in Mary Help of Christians continue to shape Catholic education worldwide.
