THE MOST HOLY TRINITY – 31st MAY 2026

Today's Readings: Be still, for the presence of the Lord...

The Sign of the Cross is one of the simplest prayers we know, yet it contains the whole heart of the Christian faith. Every time we trace the Cross upon ourselves and say, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," we are praying to the Holy Trinity — the one God who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is both a profession of faith and a prayer of trust. These are often the first words taught to a child and, for many Christians, among the last words whispered before death. In those few moments, we place ourselves within the life and love of God Himself. We remember that we were baptised "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," and that our whole life is meant to unfold within that communion of divine love. At the same time, the Sign of the Cross is also the sign of our salvation. We mark upon ourselves the Cross of Christ, by which sin and death were overcome. What once was a sign of suffering has become the sign of victory, mercy, hope, and redemption. A simple gesture — yet it speaks of the Trinity, the Cross, and the love by which we are saved.

VISITATION OF THE PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUES OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA AND THE RELICS OF SAINTS JACINTA AND FRANCISCO AT LANCASTER CATHEDRAL ON 20TH JUNE 2026.

The Centenary celebrates the occasion when the Blessed Virgin appeared to Lucia, the oldest of the Fatima seers, on the 10th December 1925, after she had joined the Dorothean Convent at Pontevedra, Spain. Our Lady appeared with the Child Jesus and requested the adoption of the Five First Saturdays' devotion by Catholics.

The National Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady, like many of those which have been sent around the world, was blessed by Pope Paul VI at Fatima in May 1967, and then given to this country by the Bishop of Fatima in 1968. It was also blessed by Pope John Paul II during his visit to Britain in 1982.

The Centenary Pilgrim Virgin Statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, is focused on the Five First Saturdays devotion.

The purpose of the visitations is to spread the message of Fatima and to encourage the local faithful to respond to Our Lady of Fatima's requests to offer prayer and reparation for the conversion of sinners as a condition for peace and the spiritual health of our country.
