Today's Readings:

"You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church..."

Today we celebrate two saints who could hardly have been more different. St Peter was a fisherman: practical, warm-hearted, impulsive, and sometimes unsure of himself. St Paul was a scholar: educated, intense, determined, and utterly committed to whatever he believed. Peter denied Jesus three times; Paul persecuted the Church. Yet Christ transformed them both. That is one of the great lessons of today's feast. God does not wait for perfect people. He works through real people. Peter and Paul had strengths and weaknesses, successes and failures, fears and hopes, just as we do. They became saints not because they were flawless, but because they allowed Christ's grace to change them. Their feast reminds us that the Church is not built from one kind of person. Peter was not Paul, and Paul was not Peter. One was called to strengthen and shepherd; the other to preach and open new paths for the Gospel. Both served the same Lord and the same mission. The same is true for us. God does not ask us to become another Peter or Paul. He asks us to be ourselves and to offer the gifts He has given us. Most of us will never preach to crowds or travel across continents. Yet every Christian is called to be an apostle. Apostleship often begins in simple ways: a word of encouragement, a faithful example, a quiet act of kindness, a willingness to forgive, or a hope that remains steady when life is difficult. Before the Gospel is explained, it is often glimpsed. May Saints Peter and Paul inspire us to follow Christ with confidence, generosity, and joy.

"...I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."
